15 16 17 18	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 4 years and, at the end of May 31, [2011] 2012 , with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
