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## Unemployment Insurance – Religious Organizations – Disclosure of Exemption from Covered Employment

- FOR the purpose of requiring certain employers to give certain notice, through a universal disclosure form, to employees whose employment is not covered employment for purposes of unemployment insurance benefits; requiring certain employers to require certain employees to sign the universal disclosure form; requiring the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to create the universal disclosure form and post the form on the Department's Web site; and generally relating to disclosure of exemption from covered employment by religious organizations.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, employment is covered (a) 2 employment if the employment is: 3 performed for a charitable, educational, religious, or other 4 organization; and excluded from the definition of "employment" in the Federal 5 6 Unemployment Tax Act solely by § 3306(c)(8) of the Act. 7 Employment is not covered employment if the employment is performed (b) 8 for: 9 (1) a church or an association or convention of churches; or 10 (2) an organization that is: 11 (i) operated primarily for religious purposes; and 12 controlled, operated, principally supported, or supervised by (ii) a church or an association or convention of churches. 13 14 Employment is not covered employment if the employment is performed (c) 15 by: (1) 16 a commissioned, licensed, or ordained minister of a church in the exercise of the ministry; or 17 a member of a religious order in the exercise of duties required by 18 (2)the order. 19 20 During any calendar quarter in which the compensation is less than \$50, 21the employment is not covered employment if it is performed for an organization that 22is exempt from income tax under: 23 § 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code unless the organization is described in § 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code; or 2425 (2) § 521 of the Internal Revenue Code. 26 **(E) (1)** UNLESS THE EMPLOYER HAS ELECTED TO BE SUBJECT TO 27 THIS TITLE UNDER § 8–203 OF THIS SUBTITLE, AN EMPLOYER OF AN EMPLOYEE 28 WHOSE EMPLOYMENT IS NOT COVERED EMPLOYMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (B)
- 30 (I) GIVE NOTICE TO THE EMPLOYEE, THROUGH A 31 UNIVERSAL DISCLOSURE FORM, THAT THE EMPLOYMENT IS NOT COVERED
