(b) (1) [A] ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2012, A license may not be renewed for a term longer than 1 year.
(2) BEGINNING ON JANUARY 1, 2013, A LICENSE MAY NOT BE RENEWED FOR A TERM LONGER THAN 2 YEARS.
