## Public Schools - Student Attendance - Preventing Chronic Absenteeism

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain schools to maintain a record of the daily 4 attendance of certain students using a certain identifier, calculate and maintain 5 a certain record of certain student attendance information, and submit a certain report to the county board of education that includes certain student attendance 6 7 information at certain times each year; requiring each county board of 8 education to calculate and maintain a certain record of certain attendance 9 information; requiring each county board to report certain information to the 10 State Board of Education at least a certain number of times each year; requiring each county board to develop and implement a certain attendance incentive 11 12 action plan that includes certain information; defining certain terms; and generally relating to tracking and reporting student attendance in public 13 14 schools.
