17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Health – General**

2 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

3 (2) “Facilities” means hospitals and related institutions whose rates
4 have been approved by the Commission.

5 (b) The Commission shall assess and collect user fees on facilities as defined
6 in this section.

7 (c) (1) The total fees assessed by the Commission may not exceed
8 ~~[\$5,500,000]~~ **\$7,000,000**.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 July 1, 2011.
