3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Supports Intensity Scale Stakeholder Advisory Group; providing for the membership and staffing of the Advisory Group; 4 $\mathbf{5}$ requiring the Advisory Group to conduct a certain review and make certain 6 recommendations; providing that the Department of Health and Mental 7Hygiene may not implement the Supports Intensity Scale until the Advisory 8 Group makes certain recommendations; requiring the Department to submit 9 certain reports to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before certain dates; and generally relating to the Supports Intensity Scale. 10

1 (C) THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF COMMUNITY SERVICES SHALL 2 PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE ADVISORY GROUP.

3 (D) THE ADVISORY GROUP SHALL REVIEW AND MAKE 4 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT REGARDING THE DEVELOPMENT 5 AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SUPPORTS INTENSITY SCALE, INCLUDING:

12 (4) DATA SPECIFIC TO THE COSTS TO SUPPORT INDIVIDUALS 13 WHO ARE RECEIVING SERVICES BEFORE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 14 SUPPORTS INTENSITY SCALE AND SUPPLEMENTARY COST INFORMATION 15 NEEDED TO GUIDE THE DEVELOPMENT OF MORE APPROPRIATE PROVIDER 16 RATES AFTER THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SUPPORTS INTENSITY SCALE;

17 (5) MONEY EXPENDED TO SERVICE PROVIDERS ANNUALLY FOR
18 EACH INDIVIDUAL, WITH ATTENTION TO NEGOTIATED ADD-ON RATES,
19 GEOGRAPHICAL DIFFERENCES, AND EMERGENCY PLACEMENTS;

30 (E) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT IMPLEMENT THE SUPPORTS 31 INTENSITY SCALE UNTIL THE ADVISORY GROUP ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS 32 SECTION HAS MADE THE RECOMMENDATIONS REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (D) OF 1 THIS SECTION AND HAS PROVIDED THE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE 2 DEPARTMENT.

3 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT AN INTERIM REPORT ON OR **(F)** 4 BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2011, AND A FINAL REPORT ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2012, TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE $\mathbf{5}$ 6 STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE 7DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SUPPORTS INTENSITY SCALE TO 8 BE USED BY THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY COMMUNITY.
