4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Education, *in consultation with* $\mathbf{5}$ county boards of education, to adopt regulations to establish report to certain 6 committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date regarding certain 7 academic performance standards that students in public high schools in the 8 State must should meet in order to participate in certain high school athletic 9 competitions; requiring the regulations <u>report</u> to include certain provisions recommendations; requiring county boards of education to allow certain 10 students to participate in certain high school athletic competitions only in 11 accordance with the regulations of the State Board; and generally relating to 12academic requirements for student participation in high school sports. 13
