#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# State Board of Nursing – Medication Technician Graduates <u>and Certified</u> <u>Medication Technicians</u>

4 FOR the purpose of extending the time period during which a medication technician  $\mathbf{5}$ graduate may practice without certification from the State Board of Nursing; 6 authorizing certain medication technicians to practice for a certain time period 7while the State Board of Nursing processes a certain application; requiring the 8 State Board of Nursing to provide a certain report to certain committees of the 9 General Assembly on or before a certain date; making this Act an emergency 10 measure; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the State Board of Nursing and medication technician graduates and certified 11

17	(iii) The length of time that has passed since the crime;

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years from the date it is enacted and, at the end of the 2-year period, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
