1 AN ACT concerning

2 Residential Child and Youth Care Practitioners – Definition <u>Certification –</u> 3 <u>Implementation Plan</u>

- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "residential child and youth care 4 practitioner" as it relates to the certification of certain residential child care 5 6 program professionals so as to exclude individuals performing certain duties in 7 certain private therapeutic group homes; defining a certain term; requiring the 8 Governor's Office for Children to establish a workgroup composed of certain representatives to develop a plan for implementation of the certification; 9 10 requiring the workgroup to take certain items into consideration in developing the plan; requiring the plan to specify a certain rate adjustment and certain 11 recommendations; requiring the Office to report on the workgroup's 12 implementation plan to the Governor and certain legislative committees on or 13 before a certain date; and generally relating to certification of residential child 14 and youth care practitioners. 15

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

26	(b) On or before October 1, 2015, an individual shall receive a certificate from
27	the Board before the individual may be a residential child and youth care practitioner

29	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
30	(a) The Governor's Office for Children shall establish a workgroup composed
31	of representatives of the State Board for Certification of Residential Child Care
32	Program Professionals, the Department of Human Resources, the Department of

1 2 3 4	Health and Mental Hygiene, the Department of Juvenile Services, the Interagency Rates Committee, residential child care programs, the Community Behavioral Health Association of Maryland, Maryland Association of Resources for Families and Youth, and other interested persons to:
5 6	(1) <u>determine whether it is feasible to implement the certification of residential child and youth care practitioners in 2015; and</u>
7 8	(2) <u>develop a plan for implementation of the certification of residential child and youth care practitioners.</u>
9 10	(b) In determining the feasibility of implementing certification in 2015 and in developing the implementation plan, the workgroup shall take into consideration:
11	(1) the costs of implementing certification, including:
12 13 14	(i) the costs to residential child care programs of hiring and retaining residential child and youth care practitioners who meet the certification requirements;
15 16	(ii) other costs incurred by residential child care programs to meet the certification requirements; and
17 18	(iii) any additional costs to the State Board for Certification of Residential Child Care Program Professionals to meet the implementation date;
19 20 21	(2) any savings, that residential child care programs might realize from certification to offset their costs, such as potential savings from reduced staff turnover;
22 23	(3) efficient ways to reduce additional costs, such as "train the trainer" programs and common evaluation tools;
24 25 26	(4) the impact of additional costs, net of any savings and efficiencies, to residential care programs on rates established by the Interagency Rates Committee; and
27 28 29	(5) any additional funding sources, separate from the rates established by the Interagency Rates Committee, that may be available to support the additional costs.
30	(c) The implementation plan shall specify:
31 32	(1) the adjustment in rates needed to support the additional costs of certification;

6 7 8 9 10	(d) On or before September 1, 2011, the Governor's Office for Children shall report on the workgroup's implementation plan to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that the rates established for residential child care programs by the Interagency Rates Committee reflect any adjustment, specified in the plan required under Section 2 of this Act, needed to support the additional costs of certification of residential child and youth care practitioners.
