A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Construction and Development Projects – Expedited Approval of State 3 Permits

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of the Environment and the State $\mathbf{5}$ Highway Administration to develop and implement processes to expedite the 6 approval of State permits for construction and development projects that have $\overline{7}$ received "fast track" or similar status from a county in the State or that will 8 create a significant number of jobs and have a positive economic impact on the 9 State; requiring the Department and the Administration to report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; making this Act an emergency 10 measure; and generally relating to State permits for construction and 11 12development projects in the State.

13 Preamble

14 WHEREAS, The national recession has resulted in unprecedented economic15 harm to the State of Maryland; and

16 WHEREAS, Even as there are signs of economic recovery, job loss continues and 17 evidence that there will be a jobless recovery continues to mount; and

18 WHEREAS, The prolonged nature of the recession has inflicted profound 19 damage on the State's construction and development sectors; and

WHEREAS, The often lengthy process of obtaining a State permit for a construction or development project may needlessly delay the commencement of otherwise "shovel ready" projects and impede the creation of jobs in the State; and

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1 WHEREAS, Job creation is vital to the future of the State of Maryland; now, 2 therefore,

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 4 MARYLAND, That the Department of the Environment and the State Highway 5 Administration shall develop and implement processes to expedite the approval of 6 permits for construction and development projects that have received "fast track" or 7 similar status from a county in the State or that will create a significant number of 8 jobs and have a positive economic impact on the State.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before July 1, 10 2011, the Department of the Environment and the State Highway Administration 11 shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 12 Government Article, on the implementation of this Act.

13 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 14 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, 15 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 16 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 17 the date it is enacted.
