### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Health Occupations Boards – Discipline of Health Care Practitioners – Failure to Comply with Governor's Order

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain health occupations boards to take certain  $\mathbf{5}$ actions against certain health care practitioners under certain circumstances 6 and subject to certain hearing provisions; prohibiting certain health care 7practitioners from knowingly and willfully failing to comply with certain 8 provisions of law; subjecting certain health care practitioners to certain 9 discipline under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the discipline 10 of health care practitioners for the failure to comply with the Governor's order 11 relating to catastrophic health emergencies.

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

9 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER" MEANS A PERSON 10 WHO IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED, OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED TO PRACTICE A 11 HEALTH OCCUPATION UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

12 (B) SUBJECT TO THE HEARING PROVISIONS THAT GOVERN THE 13 DISCIPLINE OF A HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER BY EACH RESPECTIVE HEALTH 14 OCCUPATION OCCUPATIONS BOARD, A HEALTH OCCUPATION OCCUPATIONS 15 BOARD MAY REPRIMAND, PLACE ON PROBATION, OR SUSPEND OR REVOKE A 16 LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF ANY HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER UNDER THE 17 BOARD'S JURISDICTION WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH § 14–3A–03(C) OF THE 18 PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE.

21 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

22 (e) "Heath care provider" means:

23 (1) a health care facility as defined in § 19-114(d)(l) of the 24 Health – General Article;

25 (2) a health care practitioner as defined in § 19–114(e) of the 26 Health – General Article; and

27 (3) an individual licensed or certified as an emergency medical
28 services provider under § 13–516 of the Education Article.

30 (c) The Governor may order any health care provider, who does not 31 voluntarily participate, to participate in disease surveillance, treatment, and 32 suppression efforts or otherwise comply with the directives of the Secretary or other 33 designated official. 1 14–3A–08.

2 (a) (1) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS 3 SECTION, A person may not knowingly and willfully fail to comply with an order, 4 requirement, or directive issued under this subtitle.

5 [(b)] (2) A person who violates [subsection (a) of this section] PARAGRAPH 6 (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to 7 imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.

8 (B) (1) A HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER, AS DEFINED IN § 19–114(E) 9 OF THE HEALTH – GENERAL ARTICLE, MAY NOT KNOWINGLY AND WILLFULLY 10 FAIL TO COMPLY WITH § 14–3A–03(C) OF THIS SUBTITLE.

11 (2) A HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH 12 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINE 13 UNDER  $\frac{1-214}{1-219}$  OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2011.
