## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

FOR the purpose of requiring certain health care providers to complete certain course work or training relating to eating disorders; establishing certain requirements for the course work or training; requiring certain health care providers to make a certain attestation to certain licensing boards at a certain time; providing that a health care provider is exempt from this Act under certain circumstances; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the training of health care providers about eating disorders.

16 Preamble

- WHEREAS, In the United States, 24 million people suffer from anorexia nervosa, bulimia nervosa, and binge eating disorder; and
- WHEREAS, Anorexia has the highest mortality rate of any mental illness, and eating disorders lead to severe, chronic physical health conditions; and
- WHEREAS, Eating disorders are often not recognized and diagnosed until the physical health of an individual is compromised and the illness is entrenched, at which

23 point irreversible damage already may have occurred; and



- WHEREAS, Studies have demonstrated a link between the early intervention for eating disorders and treatment outcome; and
- WHEREAS, Early recognition of eating disorders is cost effective, as it may prevent the development of full-syndrome disorders and chronic conditions; and
- WHEREAS, Binge eating disorder is the most prevalent eating disorder, which often leads to obesity; and
- WHEREAS, Obesity in the United States costs \$147 billion each year in direct medical costs, which is approximately 9% of all medical spending; now, therefore,
- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 11 Article Health General
- 12 SUBTITLE 14. HEALTH CARE PROVIDER TRAINING ON EATING DISORDERS.
- 13 **20–1401.**
- 14 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE, "HEALTH CARE PROVIDER" MEANS A LICENSED PHYSICIAN, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, DENTIST, NURSE, SOCIAL WORKER, OR
- 16 PSYCHOLOGIST.
- 17 (B) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION, A
- 18 HEALTH CARE PROVIDER SHALL COMPLETE ONLINE COURSE WORK OR
- 19 TRAINING ON THE EARLY RECOGNITION OF AND INTERVENTION FOR EATING
- 20 **DISORDERS.**
- 21 (C) THE COURSE WORK OR TRAINING REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION
- 22 SHALL BE:
- 23 (1) APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT; AND
- 24 (2) CONSISTENT WITH ANY STANDARDS OR BEST PRACTICES 25 ESTABLISHED BY THE ACADEMY FOR EATING DISORDERS.
- 26 (D) THE ONLINE COURSE WORK OR TRAINING REQUIRED UNDER THIS
- 27 SECTION SHALL BE AT LEAST 1 HOUR IN LENGTH AND SHALL INCLUDE
- 28 INFORMATION REGARDING PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL, AND BEHAVIORAL
- 29 INDICATORS OF EATING DISORDERS.
- 30 (E) A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER SHALL ATTEST TO THE APPROPRIATE
- 31 LICENSING BOARD ON RENEWAL OF LICENSURE THAT THE HEALTH CARE

- 1 PROVIDER HAS COMPLETED THE COURSE WORK OR TRAINING REQUIRED
- 2 UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 3 (F) A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS 4 OF THIS SECTION IF THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER CAN DEMONSTRATE, TO THE
- 5 SATISFACTION OF THE APPROPRIATE LICENSING BOARD, THAT:
- 6 (1) THE NATURE OF THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER'S PRACTICE 7 DOES NOT REQUIRE EDUCATION ABOUT EATING DISORDERS;
- 8 (2) THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER HAS COMPLETED COURSE
- 9 WORK OR TRAINING THAT IS EQUIVALENT TO THE COURSE WORK OR TRAINING
- 10 REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION; OR
- 11 (3) A GOOD CAUSE EXISTS THAT PREVENTS THE HEALTH CARE
- 12 PROVIDER FROM COMPLETING THE COURSE WORK OR TRAINING REQUIRED
- 13 UNDER THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 15 October 1, 2011.
