- 25 (A) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, THE PROVISIONS AND
- 26 PROCEDURES OF TITLE 12 OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE USED AND APPLIED TO
- 27 ANY PERSON THAT KNOWINGLY OR RECKLESSLY VIOLATES:
- 28 (1) This subtitle; and
- 29 (2) ANY REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

- 1 (B) A PENALTY IMPOSED FOR A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE IS
 2 PAYABLE TO THE FUND AND MAY BE COLLECTED IN ANY MANNER PROVIDED BY
 3 LAW FOR THE COLLECTION OF DEBTS.
- 4 (C) THE DEPARTMENT AND OTHER AGENCIES ASSIGNED TO SUPPORT 5 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENFORCE THIS SUBTITLE.
- 6 (D) UNLESS A PERSON SERVED WITH NOTICE OF A PENALTY UNDER
 7 THIS PART MAKES A WRITTEN REQUEST FOR A HEARING WITHIN 30 DAYS OF
 8 RECEIPT OF THE NOTICE, THE PENALTY IS CONSIDERED FINAL.
- 9 (E) If A PERSON REQUIRED TO PAY A FINAL PENALTY IMPOSED UNDER
 10 THIS PART FAILS TO PAY WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE PENALTY BECOMES FINAL,
 11 A LIEN SHALL BE RECORDED AGAINST ANY REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE
 12 PERSON IN THE AMOUNT OF THE PENALTY, TOGETHER WITH INTEREST AND ANY
 13 COSTS THAT MAY ACCRUE.
- 14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 15 (a) The Department of Agriculture shall establish a tracking system to facilitate the reporting, recording, and investigating of suspicious pesticide purchases.
- 17 (b) The tracking system shall include:
- 18 (1) A toll free telephone line for citizens to anonymously report suspicious pesticide purchases; and
- 20 (2) A database, maintained by the Department, to record all citizen 21 reports.
- 22 (c) Once a report has been entered into the database, the Department shall:
- 23 (1) Review the report; and
- 24 (2) Forward to the appropriate federal or State law enforcement 25 agency any report the Department determines to contain credible evidence of 26 potentially dangerous or illegal activity.
- 27 (d) On or before October 1, 2012, the Department shall adopt regulations to 28 carry out these provisions.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 July 1, 2011.
