## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Chesapeake Bay Phosphorus Reduction Act of 2011

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting low phosphorous fertilizers from being used on 4 established turf; prohibiting specialty fertilizers from being labeled for certain 5 uses after a certain date; providing for a certain exception to the prohibition; 6 requiring the Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the University of 7 Maryland, to adopt regulations requiring certain signs to be posted where 8 specialty fertilizer is sold or distributed after a certain date; requiring the sign 9 to contain certain information; prohibiting certain fertilizers from being sold or distributed for use on established lawns, grass, or turf; making technical and 10 11 conforming changes; and generally relating to the regulation of fertilizer.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Agriculture

2	(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
3	(p) "Low phosphorous fertilizer" means fertilizer:
4 5	(1) Containing not more than 5% of available phosphoric acid ( $H_3PO_4$ ) and
6 7 8	(2) That has an application rate not to exceed 0.25 pound of available phosphoric acid $(H_3PO_4)/1,000$ square feet/application and 0.5 pound of available phosphoric acid $(H_3PO_4)/1,000$ square feet/year.
9 10 11 12	(y) "Specialty fertilizer" means a commercial fertilizer distributed primarily for nonfarm use, such as home gardens, lawns, shrubbery, flowers, golf courses municipal parks, cemeteries, greenhouses, and nurseries, and may include commercial fertilizers used for any research or experimental purpose.

14 15	(e) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "SPECIALTY FERTILIZER" INCLUDES LOW PHOSPHOROUS FERTILIZER.
16	(2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:
17 18	(I) SEED STARTER FERTILIZER FOR USE ON NEWLY ESTABLISHED LAWNS OR TURF; OR
19 20 21	(II) FERTILIZER USED FOR MAINTENANCE ON LAWNS GRASS, OR TURF WHEN A PHOSPHOROUS DEFICIENCY IS DEMONSTRATED BY A SOIL TEST.
22 23 24	[(1)] (3) Except as provided in paragraph [(2)] (4) of this subsection on or after April 1, 2011, a lawn fertilizer with an available phosphoric acid (H <sub>3</sub> PO <sub>4</sub> content greater than 5%:
25 26	(i) May not be labeled for use on established lawns [or], grass OR TURF;
27	(ii) May not be labeled with spreader settings; and
28 29 30	(iii) Shall be marked with the words "NOT FOR USE ON ESTABLISHED LAWNS [OR], GRASS, <b>OR TURF</b> " in at least a three–quarter inclined font and in a legible and conspicuous manner on the front side of the container.

1 2	[(2) This subsection does not apply to seed starter fertilizer for use on newly established lawns or turf.]
3 4	(4) ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 2012, A SPECIALTY FERTILIZER WITH AVAILABLE PHOSPHOROUS:
5 6	(I) MAY NOT BE LABELED FOR USE ON ESTABLISHED LAWNS, GRASS, OR TURF;
7	(II) MAY NOT BE LABELED WITH SPREADER SETTINGS; AND
8 9 10 11	(III) SHALL BE MARKED WITH THE WORDS "NOT FOR USE ON ESTABLISHED LAWNS, GRASS, OR TURF" IN AT LEAST A THREE-QUARTER INCH FONT AND IN A LEGIBLE AND CONSPICUOUS MANNER ON THE FRONT SIDE OF THE CONTAINER.
12 13 14 15	(5) (I) BY APRIL 1, 2012, THE DEPARTMENT, IN COOPERATION WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS REQUIRING THE POSTING OF A SIGN AT ANY LOCATION WHERE SPECIALTY FERTILIZER IS OFFERED FOR SALE OR DISTRIBUTED.
16 17 18 19 20	(II) THE SIGN REQUIRED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL CONTAIN INFORMATION, BASED ON GUIDELINES ADOPTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, THAT GUIDES CONSUMERS ON THE PROPER USE OF LAWN CARE PRODUCTS TO AVOID POLLUTION IN THE CHESAPEAKE BAY AND OTHER WATERS OF THE STATE.

22 23 24 25	(a) (1) [Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, on or after April 1, 2011, a person may not sell or distribute for use or sale at a retail establishment in the State any fertilizer intended for use on established lawns or grass unless it is low phosphorous fertilizer.
26	(2)] This subsection does not apply to:
27 28	(i) A landscaping contractor who is licensed under Title 8 of the Business Regulation Article; or
29 30	(ii) A salesperson, employee, or other agent of a landscaping contractor who is licensed under Title 8 of the Business Regulation Article.
31	(2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION,

ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 2011, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR DISTRIBUTE FOR USE OR SALE AT A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT IN THE STATE ANY FERTILIZER

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- 1 INTENDED FOR USE ON ESTABLISHED LAWNS OR GRASS UNLESS IT IS LOW 2 PHOSPHOROUS FERTILIZER.
- 3 (b) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "SPECIALTY FERTILIZER" INCLUDES 4 LOW PHOSPHOROUS FERTILIZER.
- 5 (2) ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 2012, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR
  6 DISTRIBUTE FOR USE OR SALE IN THE STATE ANY SPECIALTY FERTILIZER WITH
  7 AVAILABLE PHOSPHOROUS CONTENT INTENDED FOR USE ON ESTABLISHED
  8 LAWNS OR GRASS UNLESS IT IS INTENDED FOR USE AS A SEED STARTER ON
  9 NEWLY ESTABLISHED LAWNS, GRASS, OR TURF, CONSISTENT WITH THE
  10 RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND.
- 11 **(C)** (1) On or before April 1, 2011, a manufacturer of lawn fertilizer whose products are sold in the State shall reduce by 50% from 2006 levels the amount of available phosphoric acid  $(H_3PO_4)$  resulting from the application of its lawn care products within the State.
- 15 (2) The amount of available phosphoric acid (H<sub>3</sub>PO<sub>4</sub>) resulting from 16 the application within the State of lawn care products sold or distributed by a 17 manufacturer may not exceed an average of 1.5% available phosphoric acid (H<sub>3</sub>PO<sub>4</sub>) if, 18 prior to April 1, 2010, the manufacturer did not sell or distribute fertilizer in the State 19 intended for use on established lawns or grass.
- 20 (3) Beginning in 2011, a manufacturer of fertilizer whose products are sold in the State shall report the pounds of phosphorus in its lawn care products sold at retail locations in the State to the Department at the end of each calendar year.
- [(c)] (D) The Department may adopt regulations to implement this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011.
