1 AN ACT concerning

State Government – Equal Access to Public Services – Individuals with Limited English Proficiency – Report

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring each State department, agency, and program to report $\mathbf{5}$ to the Department of Human Resources on or before a certain date each year on 6 the actual costs incurred in complying with certain provisions of law that 7 require equal access to public services for individuals with limited English 8 proficiency; requiring the Department to report annually to the General 9 Assembly on or before a certain date on the actual costs incurred by each State 10 department, agency, and program in complying with certain provisions of law that require equal access to public services for individuals with limited English 11 12proficiency; requiring the Department to make a certain report available to the 13 public on the Department's Web site; and generally relating to reporting the costs incurred in providing equal access to public services for individuals with 14 limited English proficiency. 15

26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 27 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – State Government
10–1101.
The General Assembly finds that the inability to speak, understand, or read the English language is a barrier that prevents access to public services provided by State departments, agencies, and programs, and that the public services available through these entities are essential to the welfare of Maryland residents. It is the policy of the State that State departments, agencies, and programs shall provide equal access to public services for individuals with limited English proficiency.
10–1105.
The Department of Human Resources, in consultation with the Office of the Attorney General, shall provide central coordination and technical assistance to State departments, agencies, and programs to aid compliance with this subtitle.
10-1106.
(A) ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 30 OF EACH YEAR, EACH STATE

NOVEMBER 30 OF EACH YEAR, EACH STATE 14DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, AND PROGRAM SHALL REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT 15OF HUMAN RESOURCES ON THE ACTUAL COSTS INCURRED IN COMPLYING WITH 16 17THIS SUBTITLE FOR EACH FUNCTION, PROGRAM, SERVICE, OR OTHER ACTIVITY 18OF THE DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, OR PROGRAM.

ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT 19 **(B) OF HUMAN RESOURCES SHALL:** 20

21(1) **REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH** 22§ 2–1246 OF THIS ARTICLE, ON THE ACTUAL COSTS INCURRED IN COMPLYING WITH THIS SUBTITLE BY EACH STATE DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, AND PROGRAM, 2324INCLUDING SPECIFIC INFORMATION AS TO THE COSTS INCURRED FOR EACH FUNCTION, PROGRAM, SERVICE, OR OTHER ACTIVITY OF EACH DEPARTMENT, 25AGENCY, AND PROGRAM; AND 26

27MAKE THE REPORT AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC ON THE (2) DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES WEB SITE. 28

29SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 October 1, 2011.

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
