CHAPTER	
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<u>Task Force on Funding a</u> Green Technology, Life Science, and Health Information Technology Loan Assistance Repayment Program

FOR the purpose of establishing the <u>Task Force on Funding a</u> Green Technology, Life Science, and Health Information Technology Loan Assistance Repayment Program; requiring the Office of Student Financial Assistance to assist in the repayment of any federal or State higher education loan owed by a resident of the State who meets certain requirements; specifying that certain loan assistance may only be used to repay certain higher education loans; specifying the amount of assistance that may be awarded; specifying that an individual awarded assistance may only receive assistance for a certain number of years; specifying that the assistance awarded to an individual, when combined with certain other assistance, may not exceed a certain amount; requiring the Office to adopt certain regulations; requiring that funds for the Program be provided on an annual basis in the State budget; requiring the Office to submit a certain report on or before a certain date each year to the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly; defining certain terms; providing for the members of the Task Force; providing for the designation of a chair of the Task Force; requiring the Governor's Workforce Investment Board to provide staff for the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation; providing that a member of the Task Force may receive reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make certain recommendations on funding a green technology, life science, and health
