Video Lottery Operation Licensees - Noninterference

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a video lottery operation licensee from directly or indirectly interfering with, hindering, obstructing, impeding, or taking any 4 5 action to delay the implementation or establishment of a video lottery facility by 6 any other video lottery operation licensee or applicant; requiring the State 7 Lottery Commission to adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this Act; 8 requiring that the regulations adopted by the State Lottery Commission include 9 certain provisions; providing for the application of this Act; making this Act an 10 emergency measure; and generally relating to video lottery facilities and video 11 lottery operation licenses.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all of the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
