# A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Electric Company Franchise – Abandonment and Transfer

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Service Commission to initiate a proceeding 4 to determine whether a certain electric company has abandoned or  $\mathbf{5}$ constructively abandoned its franchise as an electric company in the State; 6 requiring the Commission to consider certain conditions in making a certain 7determination; deeming that a certain electric company has abandoned or 8 constructively abandoned a certain franchise if the Commission finds that the 9 electric company has demonstrated certain conditions; requiring the Commission to make a certain conclusive finding by a certain date; requiring 10 the Commission to initiate a certain proceeding if the Commission makes a 11 12certain finding; requiring the Commission to report to the General Assembly on 13 its findings by a certain date; and generally relating to the abandonment and transfer of an electric company franchise. 14

# 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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# Article – Public Utilities

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1 (a) (1) The Commission may require a public service company to continue 2 any service that the public service company renders to the public under any franchise, 3 right, or permit, after any applicable expiration date.

4 (2) Unless authorized by the Commission, a public service company 5 may not discontinue or abandon a service under a franchise, right, or permit.

6 (3) The Commission may authorize a public service company to 7 discontinue or abandon a service under a franchise, right, or permit if the Commission 8 finds that the present or future public convenience and necessity allows the 9 discontinuance or abandonment.

10 (4) Denial of authorization to discontinue or abandon a service under a
 11 franchise, right, or permit does not preclude subsequent reapplication.

12 (b) (1) Whenever the Commission authorizes the abandonment or 13 discontinuance of a franchise, right, or permit, as a whole or in part, that involves any 14 service to or from a suburban community, the Commission:

- (i) shall consider all applications to acquire the franchise, right,or permit to render the service; and
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(ii) shall grant the application to the best qualified applicant.

18 (2) An abandoned or discontinued right that extends between mid-city 19 and suburban termini shall continue to extend between the mid-city and suburban 20 termini if the abandoned or discontinued right:

(i) as acquired by the abandoning or discontinuing public
 service company or its predecessor, extended from mid-city to suburban termini; or

(ii) was operated between the mid-city and suburban termini
 during most of its existence or for an aggregate of at least 15 years.

(a) The Commission may authorize the acts described in §§ 5–202, 5–203,
and 5–205 of this title and § 6–101(a) of this article if it finds that the authorization is
consistent with the public convenience and necessity.

29 (b) Authority that the Commission grants under §§ 5–202 and 5–203 of this 30 title does not:

- 31 (1) revive a lapsed franchise;
- 32 (2) validate an invalid franchise;
- 33 (3) enlarge or add to the powers and privileges of a franchise; or

1	(4) waive a forfeiture.

<b>5</b>	(1) assign, lease, or transfer a franchise or a right under a franchise;

$11 \\ 12 \\ 13$	A public service company shall furnish equipment, services, and facilities that are safe, adequate, just, reasonable, economical, and efficient, considering the conservation of natural resources and the quality of the environment.
14	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
15 16 17 18	(1) On or before September 1, 2011, the Public Service Commission shall initiate a proceeding to determine whether Potomac Electric Power Company has abandoned or constructively abandoned its franchise as an electric company in the State.
$19 \\ 20 \\ 21$	(2) In determining whether Potomac Electric Power Company has abandoned or constructively abandoned its franchise as an electric company, the Commission shall consider if the electric company:
22 23	(i) has failed to comply with § 5–303 of the Public Utilities Article;
$\begin{array}{c} 24 \\ 25 \end{array}$	(ii) has failed to provide a service that the Commission requires the electric company to provide as a franchisee; and
$\frac{26}{27}$	(iii) is presently operating or may operate in the future in a manner that is not consistent with the public convenience and necessity.
28 29 30	(3) Potomac Electric Power Company is deemed to have abandoned or constructively abandoned its franchise as an electric company if the Commission finds that the electric company has demonstrated any of the conditions specified in

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1 (4) On or before December 1, 2011, the Commission shall make a 2 conclusive finding as to whether Potomac Electric Power Company has abandoned or 3 constructively abandoned its franchise as an electric company;

4 (5) If the Commission makes a conclusive finding that Potomac 5 Electric Power Company has abandoned or constructively abandoned its franchise as 6 an electric company, the Commission shall immediately initiate a proceeding to 7 transfer the franchise to another public service company in an orderly manner; and

8 (6) On or before December 15, 2011, the Commission shall report to 9 the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, 10 on its conclusive finding as to whether Potomac Electric Power Company has 11 abandoned or constructively abandoned its franchise as an electric company and the 12 status of any future proceedings with regard to the abandonment of the franchise.

13 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect14 July 1, 2011.
