A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Northeastern Maryland Higher Education and Applied Technology Center

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Northeastern Maryland Higher Education and 4 Applied Technology Center; providing that the Center shall be governed by a 5 certain Board; establishing the number of voting Board members; providing for 6 the appointment of Board members; establishing the term lengths for Board 7 members; providing for the appointment of a Board chair; providing for the 8 establishment of certain committees; establishing the number of nonvoting 9 members; providing for the reimbursement of certain expenses; establishing the 10 length of members' initial terms; specifying the Board's powers; requiring the 11 Board to fulfill certain duties; providing for a director of the Center; specifying 12 the procedure for selecting a director; requiring the director to fulfill certain 13 duties; requiring the submission of a budget for certain purposes; specifying the 14 procedures for requesting certain appropriations; providing for the disposition of 15 certain property by the Board; providing certain liability protections for the 16 Board, its agents, and employees; defining certain terms; declaring the intent of 17 the General Assembly; and generally relating to the establishment of the 18 Northeastern Maryland Higher Education and Applied Technology Center.

WHEREAS, There is a growing need for higher education in Northeastern Maryland; and

- 13 (A) THE BOARD CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING NINE VOTING MEMBERS:
- 14 (1) FIVE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR;
- 15 (2) THREE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE HARFORD COUNTY
- 16 EXECUTIVE; AND
- 17 (3) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE CECIL
- 18 COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.
- 19 (B) (1) EACH MEMBER SERVES FOR A TERM OF 5 YEARS AND UNTIL A
- 20 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- 21 (2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY
- 22 THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD ON JULY 1, 2011.
- 23 (3) A MEMBER APPOINTED TO FILL A VACANCY IN AN UNEXPIRED
- 24 TERM SERVES ONLY FOR THE REMAINDER OF THAT TERM AND UNTIL A
- 25 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- 26 (C) (1) THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD SHALL APPOINT ONE OF THE
- 27 VOTING MEMBERS TO ACT AS CHAIR.
- 28 (2) THE VOTING MEMBERS MAY ELECT OTHER OFFICERS AND
- 29 ESTABLISH COMMITTEES, INCLUDING ADVISORY COMMITTEES, AS NEEDED.

- 24**(3)** ADOPT REASONABLE RULES, REGULATIONS, OR BYLAWS TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE. 25
- 26(C) THE BOARD MAY FIX THE SALARIES AND TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT OF THE DIRECTOR AND OTHER EMPLOYEES OF THE CENTER. 27
- 28THE BOARD MAY PURCHASE, LEASE, OR OTHERWISE ACQUIRE ANY PROPERTY IT CONSIDERS NECESSARY FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CENTER. 29

- 1 (E) (1) THE BOARD MAY SELL, LEASE, OR OTHERWISE DISPOSE OF 2 CENTER ASSETS OR PROPERTY.
- 3 (2) THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTER OR THE CHAIR OF THE 4 BOARD MAY EXECUTE A CONVEYANCE OR OTHER LEGAL DOCUMENT UNDER AN APPROPRIATE RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD.
- 6 (F) THE BOARD SHALL ENSURE THAT ALL ACADEMIC PROGRAMS AND POLICIES OF THE CENTER ARE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE POLICIES OF AND APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION.
- 9 (G) THE BOARD MAY ENTER INTO CONTRACTS OR OTHER AGREEMENTS
 10 WITH ANY INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION FOR THE PROVISION OF UPPER
 11 DIVISION UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE PROGRAMS TO MEET THE HIGHER
 12 EDUCATION NEEDS OF NORTHEASTERN MARYLAND.
- 13 (H) THE BOARD MAY APPLY, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND ANY GIFT, 14 APPROPRIATION, OR GRANT FROM THE STATE, COUNTY, OR FEDERAL 15 GOVERNMENT OR ANY OTHER PERSON.
- 16 (I) THE BOARD MAY CHARGE REASONABLE FEES TO COVER THE 17 OVERHEAD COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH PROVIDING UPPER DIVISION 18 UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE PROGRAMS.
- 19 (J) THE BOARD MAY SUE AND BE SUED.
- 20 (K) THE BOARD MAY MAKE AGREEMENTS WITH THE FEDERAL, STATE, 21 OR COUNTY GOVERNMENTS OR ANY OTHER PERSON, IF IT CONSIDERS THE 22 AGREEMENT ADVISABLE FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CENTER.
- 23 (L) THE BOARD MAY ADOPT A CORPORATE SEAL.
- 24 (M) IN ADDITION TO OTHER REPORTS THAT MAY BE REQUIRED BY THE 25 COMMISSION, THE BOARD SHALL:
- 26 (1) KEEP RECORDS THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH SOUND 27 BUSINESS PRACTICES AND ACCOUNTING RECORDS USING GENERALLY 28 ACCEPTED ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES;
- 29 (2) CAUSE AN AUDIT BY AN INDEPENDENT CERTIFIED PUBLIC 30 ACCOUNTANT TO BE MADE OF THE ACCOUNTS AND TRANSACTIONS OF THE 31 CENTER AND THE CONCLUSION OF EACH FISCAL YEAR; AND

- 1 **(3)** FOR ANY STATE MONEYS, BE SUBJECT TO AN AUDIT BY THE 2 OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE AUDITS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 2–1220 THROUGH 3 2-1227 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE. 4 THE BOARD SHALL ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH HARFORD 5 COUNTY TO ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR THE USE AND OPERATION OF THE 6 CENTER. 7 24-3A-05. 8 (A) THE BOARD SHALL APPOINT A DIRECTOR OF THE CENTER. 9 **(B)** THE DIRECTOR SHALL: 10 **(1)** REPORT DIRECTLY TO THE BOARD; 11 **(2)** RECOMMEND THE APPOINTMENT BY THE BOARD OF 12 EMPLOYEES NECESSARY FOR THE EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATION OF THE 13 CENTER; 14 **(3)** RECOMMEND THE DISCHARGE OF EMPLOYEES FOR GOOD 15 CAUSE AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS AND POLICIES; 16 BE RESPONSIBLE TO THE BOARD FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE **(4)** 17 CENTER AND FOR ITS ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION; ATTEND ALL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD, EXCEPT THOSE 18 **(5)** 19 INVOLVING THE DIRECTOR'S PERSONAL POSITION; AND 20 PERFORM OTHER DUTIES AS ASSIGNED BY THE BOARD. **(6)**

- 22 (A) THE BUDGET OF THE CENTER, AS DEVELOPED BY THE BOARD, 23 SHALL:
- 24 (1) BE SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSION AND THE APPROPRIATE
 25 HARFORD AND CECIL COUNTY GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS FOR INFORMATIONAL
 26 PURPOSES; AND
- 27 (2) INCLUDE PERSONNEL DETAIL.

- 1 (B) REQUESTS FOR APPROPRIATIONS FOR OPERATING EXPENSES FROM 2 HARFORD AND CECIL COUNTIES SHALL BE MADE TO THE APPROPRIATE 3 COUNTY OFFICIALS IN ACCORDANCE WITH:
- 4 (1) APPLICABLE COUNTY PROCEDURES AND REQUIREMENTS; OR
- 5 (2) AN AGREEMENT WITH THE APPROPRIATE COUNTY OFFICIALS.
- 6 (C) REQUESTS FOR STATE APPROPRIATIONS FOR SPECIFIC PROJECTS 7 SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSION.
- 8 (D) PROPOSALS FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS, EITHER NEW OR 9 SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES TO EXISTING PROJECTS, SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE 10 STATE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND FISCAL PLANNING.
- 11 (E) THE MAJOR FUNCTIONS OF THE CENTER SHALL GENERALLY
- 12 CONFORM TO THOSE CONTAINED IN THE CURRENT COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY
- 13 INDUSTRY AUDIT GUIDE ISSUED BY THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF CERTIFIED
- 14 Public Accountants.
- 15 **24–3A–07.**
- 16 (A) THE COUNTY GOVERNMENTS OF HARFORD AND CECIL COUNTIES
- 17 MAY APPROPRIATE MONEY TO PAY THE COST OF ESTABLISHING AND
- 18 OPERATING THE CENTER, INCLUDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A RESERVE
- 19 FUND FOR MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR.
- 20 (B) THE EXPENDITURE OF APPROPRIATED FUNDS SHALL BE
- 21 CONSISTENT WITH ALL RELEVANT STATE LAWS.
- 22 **24–3A–08.**
- 23 (A) (1) THE BOARD MAY CARRY COMPREHENSIVE LIABILITY
- 24 INSURANCE TO PROTECT THE BOARD, ITS AGENTS, AND EMPLOYEES.
- 25 (2) THE PURCHASE OF THE INSURANCE IS FOR AN EDUCATIONAL
- 26 PURPOSE AND IS A VALID EDUCATIONAL EXPENSE.
- 27 (B) (1) THE BOARD MAY ADOPT STANDARDS FOR THE POLICIES,
- 28 INCLUDING A MINIMUM LIABILITY COVERAGE.
- 29 (2) ANY POLICY PURCHASED AFTER THE ADOPTION OF THESE
- 30 STANDARDS SHALL CONFORM TO THESE STANDARDS.

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- 1 THE BOARD COMPLIES WITH THIS SECTION IF IT IS SELF-INSURED 2 FOR AT LEAST \$100,000 AND NOT MORE THAN \$500,000 PER OCCURRENCE, 3 THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE STATE INSURANCE UNDER COMMISSIONER. 4
- 5 (D) THIS SECTION DOES NOT PREVENT THE BOARD, ON ITS OWN 6 BEHALF, FROM RAISING THE DEFENSE OF SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY TO ANY 7 AMOUNT OF A CLAIM IN EXCESS OF THE LIMIT OF AN INSURANCE POLICY OR IN 8 EXCESS OF \$100,000 IN THE CASE OF SELF-INSURANCE.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial 10 voting members of the Board of Governors of the Center shall expire as follows:
- 11 (1) 2 members in 2012;
- 12 **(2)** 2 members in 2013;
- 13 (3) 2 members in 2014;
- 14 **(4)** 3 members in 2015.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Northeastern Maryland Higher Education and Applied Technology Center not become a degree-granting institution of higher education, but instead remain a facility where already existing degree-granting institutions may 18 offer their programs in order to meet the higher education needs of the Northeastern Maryland region.
- SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2122July 1, 2011.
