4 FOR the purpose of reducing the period of time that certain individuals at least a 5 certain age who hold a learner's instructional permit are required to wait before 6 taking certain examinations for a provisional driver's license; establishing that 7 certain driving practice requirements and a requirement to complete a certain 8 driver skills log book before taking certain examinations for a provisional 9 driver's license do not apply to an individual at least a certain age; authorizing 10 individuals at least a certain age to complete certain driver education 11 requirements through a certain Internet program; requiring the Motor Vehicle 12 Administration to adopt regulations establishing curriculum, equipment, and 13 standards for a certain Internet driver education program; and generally 14 relating to driver education requirements for obtaining a provisional driver's 15 license.
