1 AN ACT concerning

Public Employees' and Retirees' Benefit Sustainability Commission – Advance Directives

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Employees' and Retirees' Benefit 4 $\mathbf{5}$ Sustainability Commission to study and make recommendations relating to the 6 completion of advance directives used to plan for future health care decisions by 7retirees of the State Retirement and Pension System; requiring the Commission 8 to submit certain reports to a certain commission, certain committees, and the 9 Office of the Attorney General on or before a certain date; and generally relating 10 to a study by the Public Employees' and Retirees' Benefit Sustainability 11 Commission on the completion of advance directives used to plan for future 12health care decisions by retirees of the State Retirement and Pension System.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 (h) (1) On or before December 15, 2010, the Commission shall issue a 9 report of its findings and recommendations that are specific and actionable to the 10 Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the 11 Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, the 12 Joint Committee on Pensions, and the Blue Ribbon Commission to Study Retiree 13 Health Care Funding Options.

14 (2) [On] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, ON or 15 before June 30, 2011, the Commission shall issue a final report of its findings and 16 recommendations that are specific and actionable to the Governor and, in accordance 17 with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Budget and Taxation 18 Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, the Joint Committee on Pensions, 19 and the Blue Ribbon Commission to Study Retiree Health Care Funding Options.

20(3) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15, 2011, THE COMMISSION 21SHALL ISSUE A REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS WITH RESPECT TO METHODS TO FACILITATE AND ENCOURAGE MORE RETIREES OF 2223THE STATE RETIREMENT AND PENSION SYSTEM TO COMPLETE ADVANCE DIRECTIVES TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE 24STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE SENATE BUDGET AND TAXATION 2526COMMITTEE, THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND ENVIRONMENTAL 27**AFFAIRS COMMITTEE, THE HOUSE HEALTH AND GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS** THE HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE, THE JOINT 28COMMITTEE.
