1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Quiet Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task Force - Reconstitution

- 3 FOR the purpose of reconstituting the Maryland Quiet Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task Force; providing for the membership and duties of the Task Force; 4 5 providing for the staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation; authorizing a member of the Task 6 7 Force to receive reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the Task Force 8 to report to the Governor and the General Assembly by a certain date; making 9 this Act an emergency measure; providing for the termination of this Act; stating the intent of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the 10 Maryland Quiet Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task Force. 11
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That:
- 14 (a) There is a Maryland Quiet Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task Force.
- 15 (b) The Task Force consists of:
- 16 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President 17 of the Senate;
- 18 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 19 the House; and
- 20 (3) the following members, appointed by the Governor in consultation 21 with the Secretary of Transportation:
