- 4 FOR the purpose of reconstituting establishing the Maryland Quiet Vehicles and 5 Pedestrian Safety Task Force Advisory Committee; providing for the 6 membership and duties of the Task Force Advisory Committee; providing for 7 the staffing of the Task Force Advisory Committee; prohibiting a member of the 8 Task Force Advisory Committee from receiving certain compensation; 9 authorizing a member of the Task Force to receive and reimbursement for 10 certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to report to the Governor and the 11 General Assembly by a certain date; making this Act an emergency measure; providing for the termination of this Act; stating the intent of the General 12 Assembly; and generally relating to the Maryland Quiet Vehicles and 13 Pedestrian Safety Task Force Advisory Committee. 14

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Gevernor Secretary of Transportation appoint to the Maryland Quiet Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task Force Advisory Committee those individuals who formerly were appointed to the predecessor Maryland Quiet Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task Force established under Chapter 249 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2009 and who were serving on the Task Force as of December 31, 2010.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective through June 30, 2013, and, at the end of June 30, 2013, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
