A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Afterschool and Summer Learning Activity Program – Income Tax Checkoff

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Afterschool and Summer Learning 5 Activity Program to provide grants to certain organizations that serve certain 6 public school youth; requiring the Governor's Office for Children to administer 7 the Program; requiring that to be eligible for a grant from the Program the 8 organization must adopt certain standards, serve the youth at least a certain 9 number of hours, offer certain high quality activities, and provide certain 10 transportation; requiring an organization that receives a grant from the 11 Program to prepare a certain report; establishing the Maryland Afterschool and 12 Summer Learning Activity Fund to provide funds for the Program; providing 13 that the Fund may consist of certain contributions from the income tax checkoff 14 system and certain other money; establishing a certain income tax checkoff 15 system for voluntary contributions to the Fund; requiring the Comptroller to 16 include a checkoff on the individual income tax return; requiring that the 17 income tax checkoff system include a certain statement; requiring the 18 Comptroller to include certain information in each individual income tax return package; requiring the Comptroller to collect and account for contributions 19 20 made through the checkoff system and to credit the proceeds to the Fund after 21 deducting the amount necessary to administer the checkoff system; providing 22for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the Maryland 23 Afterschool and Summer Learning Activity Program and an income tax checkoff 24system for contributions to provide funds for the Program.
