BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Health Occupations Section 7–308 Annotated Code of Maryland (2009 Replacement Volume and 2010 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Health Occupations**

- 1 Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board shall issue a surviving (a) 2 spouse license to an applicant if the applicant: 3 Is the surviving spouse of a licensed mortician or licensed funeral 4 director whose license was in good standing at the time of death and who at the time 5 of death was operating and wholly or partly owned a mortuary science business; 6 **(2)** Is not a licensed mortician or licensed funeral director; 7 Submits to the Board, within [30] 60 10 days of the death of the (3)8 licensed mortician or funeral director, written verification of the death of the licensee 9 and the application required by the Board; and 10 **(4)** Pays a fee set by the Board. 11 (b) Within \(\frac{1}{2}\) months\(\frac{1}{2}\) \(\frac{1}{2}\) YEARS of the issuance of the surviving spouse license, the applicant must take the written Maryland State law examination 1213 administered by the Board under § 7–304(b), (c), (d)(1), (e), and (f) of this subtitle. 14 (2)**(I)** THE BOARD SHALL ADMINISTER THE LAW EXAMINATION TO AN APPLICANT FOR A SURVIVING SPOUSE LICENSE AT LEAST 15 16 THREE TIMES. 17 (II)The license becomes null and void if the surviving spouse fails the Maryland State law examination twice THREE TIMES. 18 19 An applicant may retake the law examination as often as necessary to fulfill the requirement of this subsection. 20 21Nothing in this section shall prevent a surviving spouse from selling the 22mortuary science business that was operated and wholly or partly owned by the 23 licensed funeral director or licensed mortician. 24Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, while a surviving spouse license is effective, it authorizes the licensee to: 25 26 Continue the operation of the mortuary science business that had 27 been operated and wholly or partly owned by the spouse of the licensee; and 28 **(2)** Assist with the planning and conducting of funeral services for that 29 mortuary science business. 30 The Board may issue a license under this section only if: (e)
- 31 (1) The business is operated under the direct supervision of a licensed 32 mortician or funeral director; and

(2)	The embalming is done by a	licensed mortician.
