1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners – Licensure and Regulation

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners to send license renewal notices by electronic means; altering the maximum amount of a certain fine; altering certain definitions; and generally relating to the licensure and regulation of physical therapists and physical therapist assistants.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 18 (b) "Board" means the State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners.

1 (c) "License" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a license issued 2 by the Board to practice:

5 (d) "Licensed physical therapist" means, unless the context requires 6 otherwise, a physical therapist who is licensed by the Board to practice physical 7 therapy.

8 (e) "Licensed physical therapist assistant" means, unless the context 9 requires otherwise, a physical therapist assistant who is licensed by the Board to 10 practice limited physical therapy.

11 (f) "Physical therapist" means an individual, licensed by the State Board of 12 Physical Therapy Examiners, who practices physical therapy and who has passed the 13 national physical therapy licensing examination administered or accepted by the 14 Board.

15 (g) "Physical therapist assistant" means an individual who practices limited 16 physical therapy and who has passed the national physical therapy licensing 17 examination administered or accepted by the Board.

(h) (1) "Practice limited physical therapy" means to [practice the health

1 (j) "Restricted license" means a license issued by the Board under and as 2 limited by § 13–314 of this title to practice physical therapy.

4 (a) A license expires on the date set by the Board, unless the license is 5 renewed for an additional term as provided in this section. A license may not be 6 renewed for a term longer than 2 years.

7 (b) (1) [At] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 8 SUBSECTION, AT least 1 month before the license expires, the Board shall send to the 9 licensee, by first-class mail to the last known address of the licensee, a renewal notice 10 that states:

[(1)] (I) The date on which the current license expires;

12 [(2)] (II) The date by which the renewal application must be received 13 by the Board for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the license expires; and

[(3)] (III) The amount of the renewal fee.

15 (2) IF REQUESTED BY A LICENSEE, THE BOARD SHALL SEND TO 16 THE LICENSEE, AT LEAST TWO TIMES WITHIN THE MONTH BEFORE A LICENSE 17 EXPIRES, A RENEWAL NOTICE BY ELECTRONIC MEANS TO THE LAST KNOWN 18 ELECTRONIC MAIL ADDRESS OF THE LICENSEE.

19 (3) IF A RENEWAL NOTICE SENT BY ELECTRONIC MEANS UNDER
20 PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION IS RETURNED TO THE BOARD AS
21 UNDELIVERABLE, THE BOARD SHALL SEND TO THE LICENSEE A RENEWAL
22 NOTICE BY FIRST-CLASS MAIL TO THE LAST KNOWN ADDRESS OF THE LICENSEE.

(c) Before the license expires, the licensee periodically may renew it for an
 additional 2-year term, if the licensee:

 - Otherwise is entitled to be licensed;
- 26 (2) Pays to the Board a renewal fee set by the Board; and
- 27 (3) Submits to the Board:

28 (i) A renewal application on the form that the Board requires;

1 (d) The Board may adopt regulations to establish continuing education 2 requirements as a condition for the renewal of licenses under this section.

3 (e) The Board shall renew the license of each licensee who meets the 4 requirements of this section.

6 (a) A person who violates any provision of this title is guilty of a 7 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$5,000] **\$10,000** or 8 imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or both.

9 (b) (1) Any person who violates § 13–401 of this subtitle is subject to a 10 civil fine of not more than \$50,000 to be assessed by the Board.

(2) The Board shall pay any penalty collected under this subsectioninto the State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners Fund.
