A BILL ENTITLED

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Transition of Developmentally Disabled Youth from Foster Care – Required Workgroup and Report

FOR the purpose of requiring the Developmental Disabilities Administration and the Social Services Administration to convene a certain workgroup; requiring the workgroup to include certain persons and examine certain methods; requiring the Developmental Disabilities Administration and the Social Services Administration to report the findings of the workgroup to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the transition of developmentally disabled youth from foster care.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That:

- (a) The Developmental Disabilities Administration in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the Social Services Administration in the Department of Human Resources shall convene a workgroup of interested stakeholders to examine:
- 16 (1) methods to ensure a smooth transition of developmentally disabled 17 youth from foster care to receiving services through the Developmental Disabilities 18 Administration at age 21; and
- 19 (2) methods to ensure that developmentally disabled youth who age 20 out of the foster care system receive a prompt evaluation for services from the 21 Developmental Disabilities Administration.
 - (b) The workgroup required under this section shall include foster parents of children who have transitioned or who are in the process of transitioning from receiving services through the Department of Human Resources to receiving services through the Developmental Disabilities Administration.



- 1 (c) On or before December 1, 2011, the Developmental Disabilities 2 Administration and the Social Services Administration shall report, in accordance 3 with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the findings of the workgroup to the 4 General Assembly.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 July 1, 2011.
