CHAPTER	

1 AN ACT concerning

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- 2 Task Force to Study the Impact of Adjunct Faculty on Graduation Rates at 3 Historically Black Institutions
- 4 FOR the purpose of creating the Task Force to Study the Impact of Adjunct Faculty on 5 Graduation Rates at Historically Black Institutions in the State; providing for 6 the membership, duties, compensation, and staffing of the Task Force; requiring 7 the Task Force to make certain findings and recommendations by a certain 8 date; requiring the Task Force to report to the Governor and certain committees 9 by a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally 10 relating to the Task Force to Study the Impact of Adjunct Faculty on Graduation Rates at Historically Black Institutions in the State. 11
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That:
- 14 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Impact of Adjunct Faculty on Graduation Rates at Historically Black Institutions in the State.
  - (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the 18 President of the Senate;

It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2013, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
