AN ACT concerning
Task Force on the Method of Selecting Membership and Operation of the Baltimore County Board of Education
FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on the Method of Selecting Membership and Operation of the Baltimore County Board of Education; providing for the chairs and staff for the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation but entitling members to reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to make certain recommendations, including recommendations regarding the method of selecting the Baltimore County Board of Education; requiring the Task Force to hold a certain number of public meetings in certain locations that allow certain persons to testify about certain issues; requiring the Task Force to make a certain report to certain persons on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force on the Method
