#### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Department of the Environment from issuing a sewage sludge utilization permit under certain circumstances; requiring the Department to record a copy of a certain permit in certain land records under certain circumstances; requiring the Department to establish and maintain a certain list of certain property; and generally relating to the use of sewage sludge.

#### 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 Article Environment
- 17 9–236.

18 **(A)** The Department shall issue a sewage sludge utilization permit to an 19 applicant who meets the requirements of this Part III of this subtitle.

# (B) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT ISSUE A SEWAGE SLUDGE UTILIZATION PERMIT UNLESS THE LAND ON WHICH THE SEWAGE SLUDGE IS TO BE APPLIED IS OWNER-OCCUPIED.

#### **SENATE BILL 404**

1 (A) To allow the public to identify every permit that the Department issues 2 for a particular tract of land, the Department shall maintain a permanent public 3 record of all sewage sludge utilization permits issued under § 9–236 of this subtitle.

4 (B) WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER EACH LAND APPLICATION OF SEWAGE 5 SLUDGE IS AUTHORIZED, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL RECORD A COPY OF THE 6 PERMIT AUTHORIZING THE APPLICATION OF SEWAGE SLUDGE IN THE LAND 7 RECORDS OF THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE LAND IS LOCATED.

### 8 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN A LIST OF 9 STATE–OWNED PROPERTY ON WHICH SEWAGE SLUDGE MAY BE APPLIED.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
October 1, 2011.
