A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Campaign Finance Entities – Loans – Reporting Requirement and Penalties

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a campaign finance entity that receives a loan under a 4 certain provision of law to report the receipt of the loan to the State Board of $\mathbf{5}$ Elections within a certain time period; requiring the State Board to post 6 information concerning the loan on the State Board Web site within a certain 7 time period; specifying that certain penalties assessed for a certain violation of 8 campaign contribution limits may be assessed against a lender, the candidate 9 whose campaign finance entity received the loan, or both; specifying that any statute of limitations associated with the assessment of certain penalties begins 10 11 on expiration of the repayment deadline for a certain loan; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to loans received by campaign 1213finance entities.
