The employee's OR INDIVIDUAL'S final evaluation in the local school system OR OUT-OF-STATE JURISDICTION from which the employee 2526**OR INDIVIDUAL** departed is satisfactory or better; and 272.There has been no break in the employee's OR 28**INDIVIDUAL'S** service between the two systems of longer than 1 year. 29(ii) A local school system may extend the probationary period for 30 a certificated employee **OR INDIVIDUAL** subject to subparagraph (i) of this paragraph
