A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Pharmacies – Delivery of Controlled Dangerous Substances**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain pharmacies to require an adult to sign for the
4 delivery of certain controlled dangerous substances to a residence; requiring the
5 State Board of Pharmacy to waive certain requirements for certain pharmacies
6 under certain circumstances; and generally relating to pharmacies and the
7 delivery of controlled dangerous substances.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Health Occupations**

16 12–403.

17 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a pharmacy for which a
18 pharmacy permit has been issued under this title:

19 (17) With regard to a prescription drug that is delivered in this State by
20 the United States mail, a common carrier, or a delivery service and is not personally
21 hand delivered directly to a patient or to the agent of the patient at the residence of
22 the patient or at another location designated by the patient, shall:

23 (i) Provide a general written notice in each shipment of a
24 prescription drug that alerts a consumer that, under certain circumstances, a

1 medication's effectiveness may be affected by exposure to extremes of heat, cold, or
2 humidity; [and]

3 (ii) Provide a specific written notice in each shipment of a
4 prescription drug that provides a consumer with a toll-free or local consumer access
5 telephone number accessible during regular hours of operation, which is designed to
6 respond to consumer questions pertaining to medications; **AND**

7 **(III) REQUIRE AN ADULT TO SIGN FOR THE DELIVERY OF A**
8 **PRESCRIPTION DRUG OR SUBSTANCE THAT IS LISTED IN SCHEDULE II AS A**
9 **CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE, AS DEFINED IN § 5-101 OF THE**
10 **CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE, TO A RESIDENCE;**

11 (c) (3) The Board shall waive the requirements of subsection [(b)(20)]
12 **(B)(17)(III) AND (20)** of this section for a pharmacy **SERVICING A NURSING**
13 **FACILITY OR** owned and operated by a hospital, nursing facility, or clinic to which the
14 public does not have access to purchase pharmaceuticals on a retail basis.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
16 October 1, 2011.
