## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Pharmacies - Delivery of Controlled Dangerous Substances

- FOR the purpose of requiring certain pharmacies to require an adult to sign for the delivery of certain controlled dangerous substances to a residence; requiring the State Board of Pharmacy to waive certain requirements for certain pharmacies under certain circumstances; and generally relating to pharmacies and the delivery of controlled dangerous substances.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Health Occupations

16 12–403.

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- 17 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a pharmacy for which a pharmacy permit has been issued under this title:
- 19 (17) With regard to a prescription drug that is delivered in this State by 20 the United States mail, a common carrier, or a delivery service and is not personally 21 hand delivered directly to a patient or to the agent of the patient at the residence of 22 the patient or at another location designated by the patient, shall:
- 23 (i) Provide a general written notice in each shipment of a 24 prescription drug that alerts a consumer that, under certain circumstances, a

- (ii) Provide a specific written notice in each shipment of a prescription drug that provides a consumer with a toll—free or local consumer access telephone number accessible during regular hours of operation, which is designed to respond to consumer questions pertaining to medications; **AND**
- (III) REQUIRE AN ADULT TO SIGN FOR THE DELIVERY OF A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OR SUBSTANCE THAT IS LISTED IN SCHEDULE II AS A CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE, AS DEFINED IN § 5–101 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE, TO A RESIDENCE;
- 11 (c) (3) The Board shall waive the requirements of subsection [(b)(20)] 12 (B)(17)(III) AND (20) of this section for a pharmacy SERVICING A NURSING 13 FACILITY OR owned and operated by a hospital, nursing facility, or clinic to which the 14 public does not have access to purchase pharmaceuticals on a retail basis.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011.
