A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Electric Companies – Extended Service Disruptions – Penalties and Ratepayer Compensation

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Service Commission to require, by regulation
 or order, an electric company to compensate a ratepayer for certain damages
 resulting from an extended disruption to electrical service, including certain
 expenses; authorizing the Commission to impose a certain penalty on an electric
 company if the Commission makes a certain determination; prohibiting certain
 costs and penalties from being passed on to ratepayers; and generally relating
 to disruptions to electrical service.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Public Utilities

19 **7–309.**

(A) THE COMMISSION SHALL REQUIRE, BY REGULATION OR ORDER, AN
 ELECTRIC COMPANY TO COMPENSATE A RATEPAYER FOR ANY DAMAGES
 INCURRED BY THE RATEPAYER AS A RESULT OF AN EXTENDED DISRUPTION TO
 ELECTRICAL SERVICE, INCLUDING:

- (1) SPOILED, CONTAMINATED, OR WASTED FOOD; AND



1 (2) THE REASONABLE EXPENSES OF ANY EMERGENCY MEASURES 2 TAKEN BY THE RATEPAYER TO COPE WITH THE DISRUPTION IN ELECTRICAL 3 SERVICE, INCLUDING TEMPORARY TRAVEL AND RELOCATION TO A HOTEL BY A 4 RESIDENTIAL RATEPAYER.

5 (B) IF THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT AN ELECTRIC COMPANY'S 6 RESPONSE TO AN EXTENDED DISRUPTION IN ELECTRICAL SERVICE IS 7 INADEQUATE TO A GIVEN CIRCUMSTANCE, THE COMMISSION MAY IMPOSE A 8 PENALTY ON AN ELECTRIC COMPANY IN AN AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING 2.5% OF 9 THE ELECTRIC COMPANY'S TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION REVENUES FOR 10 THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR.

11(C)THE COST TO AN ELECTRIC COMPANY OF ANY COMPENSATION OR12PENALTY UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE PASSED ON TO RATEPAYERS.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
