16 17 18	(2) The regulations adopted under <u>SUBSECTION</u> (A)(1) OF THIS <u>SECTION AND</u> paragraph (1) of this subsection shall require a pharmacist to submit a registration form to the Board that includes verification that the pharmacist:
19 20 21	(i) Has successfully completed a certification course approved by the Board that included instruction in the guidelines and recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention regarding vaccinations; and
22 23	(ii) Is certified in basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation and obtained the certification through in–person classroom instruction.
