15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
17	Article - Health Occupations

- Al WITHOUT A PRESCRIPTION FROM A PHYSICIAN, A pharmacist may administer [an influenza] A vaccination to an individual, AND IN THE EVENT OF A SYSTEMIC REACTION TO THE VACCINATION BY THE INDIVIDUAL, EPINEPHRINE AND DIPHENHYDRAMINE, in accordance with regulations adopted under subsection (c) of this section.
- 24A pharmacist may administer a vaccination for pneumococcal (2)25 pneumonia or herpes zoster, or any vaccination that has been determined by the

22 23 24	(b) The Board shall set reasonable fees for the administration of vaccinations, EPINEPHRINE , AND DIPHENHYDRAMINE in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
25 26 27	(c) (1) The Board, the Board of Physicians, and the Board of Nursing shall meet at least annually to jointly develop, adopt, and review regulations to provide for patient safety and to implement this section.
28 29 30	(2) The regulations adopted under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall require a pharmacist to submit a registration form to the Board that includes verification that the pharmacist:
31 32	(i) Has successfully completed a certification course approved by the Board that included instruction in the guidelines and recommendations of the

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention regarding vaccinations; and

- 1 (ii) Is certified in basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation and 2 obtained the certification through in–person classroom instruction.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 October 1, 2011.
