CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

Baltimore County - Alcoholic Beverages - Expiration of Licenses - Extension for Casualty Loss

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore $\mathbf{5}$ County under certain circumstances to extend an alcoholic beverages license for 6 a certain time if the licensed premises is forced to close because of a casualty 7 loss; authorizing the circuit court to extend a license under certain circumstances if the circuit court finds that extraordinary cause exists; 8 requiring the licensee to resume active alcoholic beverages business operations 9 under certain circumstances; making this Act an emergency measure; and 10 generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Baltimore County. 11

26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34	(5) It is the intention of this subsection that the total time period for which a license may be deemed unexpired under paragraph (2) of this subsection is 180 days if no undue hardship extension is granted and no more than 360 days if an undue hardship extension has been granted. The time period begins at the earlier of the closing of the business or cessation of alcoholic beverages business, and shall be tolled only upon the filing of an application or request described in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the expiration period to begin running again, cumulatively to the time period before the filing of the application or request, upon the occurrence of the later to occur of the following events:

10 (7) (1) IF A LICENSED PREMISES IS FORCED TO CLOSE 11 BECAUSE OF A CASUALTY LOSS, THE BOARD, WITHOUT CIRCUIT COURT 12 APPROVAL, MAY EXTEND THE LICENSE FOR NOT MORE THAN 2 YEARS AFTER 13 THE CLOSING.

14(II) THE CIRCUIT COURT MAY EXTEND A LICENSE BEYOND15AN EXTENSION GRANTED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH IF THE16CIRCUIT COURT FINDS THAT EXTRAORDINARY CAUSE EXISTS.

17 (III) IF THE CIRCUIT COURT EXTENDS A LICENSE UNDER
 18 SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, WHEN THE EXTENSION EXPIRES THE
 19 LICENSEE IMMEDIATELY SHALL RESUME ACTIVE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES
 20 BUSINESS OPERATIONS AT THE LICENSED PREMISES AND CONTINUE THE
 21 OPERATIONS AT THE LICENSED PREMISES FOR AT LEAST 1 YEAR.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
