The Weinberg Center for the Arts(WCA) is owned and operated by the City of Frederick under								

The Weinberg Center for the Arts(WCA) is owned and operated by the City of Frederick under the governance of a board of directors (WCA,Inc) appointed by the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of the City of Frederick. Built in 1926, the WCA is a 1,143 seat proscenium style performing arts center located in the Historic District of the City of Frederick. The WCA was deeded to the City of Frederick by the Weinberg Family in 1977 and has operated as a performing arts center since 1978.

The mission of the WCA is to "present culturally diverse quality professional arts programs and support local arts organizations by providing a professionally staffed and equipped facility. The WCA accomplishes this mission through the use of three strategies: 1) presentation of diverse programming in dance, theater, film, and music, 2)educational outreach that supports and enhances the curriculum of public, private, and home schools, 3) offering rental of the facility to local arts organizations for the purpose of presenting their productions.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

In FY 01 the Weinberg Center worked with the Architectural firm of GMA&D/Craig Hoopes & Associates to develop a master plan for the renovation, improvement, and restoration of the theater. The master plan includes a review and recommendations from Fisher/Dachs Theatre Consultants. Many of those recommendations were completed in 2002 in Phase One of the Master Plan and included upgrades to stage equipment, lighting system, rigging system, and new rest rooms. The second step, Phase Two, included replacing seating, installing a fire sprinkler system in the theater, re-carpeting and partial painting in the main theater. These renovations were completed in 2008. This request is to continue with renovations including a new marquee, faux painting in the lobby and theater spaces, restoration of the historic tile floor, and upgrades to the sound system.

## 28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

The concept of continuing the renovation of the Weinberg Center for the Arts is to maintain the historic structure of the building, while bringing the rest of the space into compliance for today's performing arts

The Weinberg Center for the Arts has had and will continue to have a major impact in the growth and development experienced by the City of Frederick in the past eight years. Using the State of Maryland standard of \$2.10 for every \$1.00 spent at the Weinberg Center for the Arts, economic impact to the City and County of Frederick was \$6.5 million in the 2009-2010 season and projected to be \$6.8 million in the current 2010-2011 season. Expansion in programming and attendance has averaged 22% in the past two years and is projected to continue. Nearly 40% of all programming at the Weinberg Center is community based, offering opportunities to local arts companies and performers to develop their craft in a professional setting. The educational outreach programming, smARTS, brings in more than 8,000 students each year for curriculum based arts programming in music, science, history, and math. A great amount of effort and expense has been put into the Weinberg Center's infrastructure in the past ten years by the City of Frederick including a new HVAC system and boilers for the heating system. National, state, and local grants went from \$23,000 in 2006-2007 to more than \$130,000 in the current fiscal year. Earned income has seen a major increase from \$397,212 in FY 07 to more than a projected \$660,000 in FY 11. The Weinberg Center for the Arts is celebrating 33 years as the theater for the community for Frederick City and County. Proposed renovations will assure that the Weinberg Center continues to reach out to the Frederick Community and beyond.
