### FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

Senate Bill 981 (Senators Mathias and Colburn) Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Ways and Means

#### Wicomico County - Board of Education - Selection of Members - Straw Ballot

This bill requires the Wicomico County Board of Elections, in consultation with the State Board of Elections, to hold a nonbinding referendum during the November 2012 general election regarding the selection of members of the Wicomico County Board of Education. The proposed referendum asks whether voters favor changing the method of selection for board of education members from appointment by the Governor to election by county voters.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2011.

### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** The Wicomico County Board of Elections can handle the bill's requirements with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

### Analysis

**Current Law:** The Wicomico County Board of Education consists of seven members appointed by the Governor from the county at large and serving five-year terms. An individual may not serve more than two consecutive terms.

**Background:** The Wicomico County Board of Education is one of five appointed school boards in the State, including one (Caroline County) that is in the process of transitioning to a hybrid board of appointed and elected members. Harford County has such a hybrid
