FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

Senate Bill 463

(Carroll County Senators)

Budget and Taxation

Appropriations

Carroll County - Public Facilities Bonds

This bill authorizes the Carroll County Commissioners to issue up to \$16.0 million in general obligation bonds for the acquisition, alteration, construction, improvement, or renovation of public buildings, facilities, and specified public works projects, and loans to volunteer fire departments. The date of maturity of the bonds cannot exceed 30 years.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2011.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Carroll County receives up to \$16.0 million in bond proceeds. County debt service expenditures increase by an estimated \$1.2 million annually over a 20-year period.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Commission counties do not have the legislative power to create debt; General Assembly authorization is required before any bonds can be sold. Carroll County is one of eight counties that still operate under the commission form of government.

Background: In recent years, Carroll County received authorization by the General Assembly to issue up to \$364.0 million in general obligation bonds for public facilities (**Exhibit 1**). The planned project areas for which bond proceeds would be used under

this bill is depicted in **Exhibit 2**, a detailed listing by project area is provided in **Exhibit 3**. The total amount of projects shown will be reduced to \$16 million as the proposed county budget becomes finalized.

Local Fiscal Effect: Carroll County revenues increase by up to \$16.0 million from bond proceeds. Annual debt service costs for the bonds total approximately \$1.2 million. This estimate is based on a 4.83% interest rate and a 20-year term of maturity. To the extent that the bond issuance, interest rate, or term of maturity deviate from this assumption, expenditures would adjust accordingly.

At the end of fiscal 2010, Carroll County had approximately \$350.6 million in total general obligation debt outstanding, which represented an increase of \$41.3 million over the prior year. The outstanding debt represented 1.6% of the county's assessable base and \$2,061 on a per capita basis. In fiscal 2010, the county was assigned a AA+ rating by Standard and Poor's, and has an Aa1 credit rating from Moody's Investors Service, and an AAA rating from Fitch Ratings.
