Task Force on the Membership and Operation of the Baltimore County Board of Education

This bill establishes a Task Force on the Membership and Operation of the Baltimore County Board of Education. The task force must make recommendations on the ideal size of the board of education; the most appropriate method of selecting board members; the appropriate phase-in period for changes to the existing selection process; and improving the transparency and professionalism of the board. The Office of the Baltimore County Executive must provide staff support for the task force. A report of findings and recommendations is due by October 1, 2011.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2011, and terminates December 31, 2011.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Staffing requirements and expense reimbursements for task force members can be handled with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Baltimore County Board of Education consists of 12 members, of whom 4 members are appointed from the county at large, 7 members are appointed from each of the seven legislative districts in the county, and 1 is a student member. Members serve five-year terms, except the student member who serves a one-year term.

Background: The Baltimore County Board of Education is one of five appointed school boards in the State, including one (Caroline County) that is in the process of transitioning to a hybrid board of appointed and elected members. Harford County has such a hybrid board. Eighteen local boards are elected by county voters. The selection method and number of school board members for each of the 24 local boards are shown in **Exhibit 1**.
