10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)					

Located in Silver Spring, Maryland, the AFI Silver Theatre and Cultural Center is one of the nation's premier film exhibition centers, building an appreciation of the art and artists through exploring and celebrating new and classic films and filmmakers from around the globe. AFI Silver offers a year-round program of the best in American and international cinema, featuring a dynamic mix of retrospectives, special events, tributes, on-stage guest appearances, specialty first-run movies, festivals, premieres, community-based programs and a groundbreaking educational screenings program that has reached over 50,000 middle and high school students. Anchored by the stunningly restored 1938 Silver Theatre, the three-screen AFI Silver Theatre and Cultural Center connects a diverse regional audience with the best the art form has to offer, and serves as a national model for preserving and honoring our shared film and film-going heritage.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

When AFI Silver opened in 2003, it was one of the most technologically advanced moving image exhibition centers in the world. However, much of the digital infrastructure that provides the core functionality of the AFI Silver, including critical digital cinema projection equipment and key signal routing and switching hardware needs to be replaced. This equipment has been well maintained over its operational life but it is now nearly ten years since the original design and planning work was done in 2000/2001, and the facility now faces a two-pronged challenge. First, key components of the digital infrastructure are at the end of their useful life. Second, a significant industry-wide effort took place over the past decade to embrace the new digital technologies and to establish industry standards for digital media presentation. One of the results of that effort is that the leading edge, first generation technology installed in 2002 is now obsolete, unsupported by the manufacturers, and no longer compliant with established standards. This has a very significant adverse impact on AFI Silver's ability to effectively produce programming, and impacts its activities at all levels -- ranging from its major international festival presentations to its educational screening programs for K-12 students.
