Senate Bill 988 Rules

(Senator Klausmeier)

Circuit Court - Civil Actions - Waiver of Discovery Deadlines - Informed Written Consent

This bill requires an attorney representing a client in a civil action in a circuit court to obtain the informed written consent of the client to waive any discovery deadline set by the court before waiving a discovery deadline.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill only applies to circuit court cases.

Local Effect: The bill is procedural/technical in nature and is not expected to materially affect local finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Under the Maryland Rules, parties to a civil action in a circuit court may obtain discovery by one or more of the following methods: (1) depositions upon oral examination or written questions; (2) written interrogatories; (3) production or inspection of documents or other tangible things or permission to enter upon land or other property; (4) mental or physical examinations; and (5) requests for admission of facts and genuineness of documents.

Unless the court orders otherwise, methods of discovery may be used in any sequence and the fact that a party is conducting discovery, whether by deposition or otherwise, must not operate to delay any other party's discovery. The court may at any time order that discovery be completed by a specified date or time, which must be a reasonable time after the action is at issue. However, parties to civil actions in the circuit courts are encouraged to reach agreement on a plan for the scheduling and completion of discovery.

Background: In fiscal 2009, 91,046 civil cases were filed in the circuit courts.
