BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Personnel and Pensions Section 38–103(d) and 38–104(c) Annotated Code of Maryland (2009 Replacement Volume and 2011 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 38-103.
