CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Retirement and Pension System – Military Service Credit – Reservists**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain members of the State Retirement and Pension
4 System who are members of a reserve component of the armed forces of the
5 United States to receive a certain amount of service credit under certain
6 circumstances for military service as a member of a reserve component of the
7 armed forces of the United States; and generally relating to military service
8 credit for members of a reserve component of the armed forces of the United
9 States.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 Section 38–103(d) and 38–104(c)
13 Annotated Code of Maryland
14 (2009 Replacement Volume and 2011 Supplement)

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – State Personnel and Pensions**

18 38–103.

1 (d) (1) Subject to paragraph (2)(i) of this subsection, a member of a State
2 or local retirement or pension system shall receive service credit for a period of
3 absence from employment while in military service if:

4 (i) the employment of the member under subsection (a)(2) of
5 this section is active or the employee is reinstated as a regular employee on a leave of
6 absence; and

7 (ii) membership in a State or local retirement or pension system
8 is a requirement of employment.

9 (2) (i) For an absence for military service, service credit for the
10 military service may not exceed 5 years.

11 (ii) 1. This subparagraph applies only to a member of a
12 State system.

13 2. Subject to subparagraph (i) of this paragraph and in
14 addition to any service credit received under paragraph (1) of this subsection, a
15 member of the Maryland National Guard **OR OF A RESERVE COMPONENT OF THE**
16 **ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES** who has been activated under Title 10 of
17 the United States Code and who is on active or inactive duty for training that
18 interrupts the member's service shall receive service credit at the rate of 4 months for
19 each full year for military service, not to exceed a total of 36 months.

21 (c) (1) An individual described in subsection (a) of this section may not
22 receive credit for that military service if the individual receives credit for military
23 service from another retirement system for which retirement benefits have been or
24 will be received by the individual.

25 (2) Paragraph (1) of this subsection does not apply to:

26 (i) credit for military service provided under:

27 1. the Social Security Act;

28 2. the National Railroad Retirement Act; or

29 3. Title 3 or Title 10, Chapter 1223, §§ 12731 through
30 12737 of the United States Code; or

31 (ii) disability payments from a pension or retirement system.

32 (3) (i) Military service credit under this section may not exceed 5
33 years.

1 (ii) Subject to subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, a member of
2 the Maryland National Guard **OR OF A RESERVE COMPONENT OF THE ARMED**
3 **FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES** who has not been activated under Title 10 of the
4 United States Code, shall receive service credit at the rate of 4 months for each full
5 year of service with the Maryland National Guard **OR OF A RESERVE COMPONENT**
6 **OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES**, not to exceed a total of 36
7 months.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 July 1, 2012.
