5 FOR the purpose of requiring the Prince George's County Board of Education to
6 develop and implement a certain recycling program for all facilities under the
7 jurisdiction of the county board; requiring the county board to address certain
8 issues while developing a certain recycling program; requiring the county board
9 to submit a certain report including certain information to the Prince George's
10 County Delegation to the General Assembly on or before a certain date
11 regarding a certain recycling program; defining certain terms; and generally
12 relating to a recycling program in school facilities in Prince George's County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Education**

2 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE
3 MEANINGS INDICATED.

4 (2) "RECYCLABLE MATERIALS" MEANS THOSE MATERIALS THAT:

5 (I) WOULD OTHERWISE BECOME SOLID WASTE FOR
6 DISPOSAL IN A REFUSE DISPOSAL SYSTEM; AND

7 (II) MAY BE COLLECTED, SEPARATED, OR PROCESSED AND
8 RETURNED TO THE MARKETPLACE IN THE FORM OF RAW MATERIALS OR
9 PRODUCTS.

10 (3) "RECYCLING" MEANS ANY PROCESS IN WHICH MATERIALS
11 THAT WOULD OTHERWISE BECOME SOLID WASTE ARE COLLECTED, SEPARATED,
12 OR PROCESSED AND RETURNED TO THE MARKETPLACE IN THE FORM OF RAW
13 MATERIALS OR PRODUCTS.

14 (B) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY.

15 (C) THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL
16 DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A RECYCLING PROGRAM FOR ALL FACILITIES UNDER
17 THE JURISDICTION OF THE COUNTY BOARD.

18 (D) IN DEVELOPING THE RECYCLING PROGRAM UNDER SUBSECTION (C)
19 OF THIS SECTION, THE COUNTY BOARD SHALL ADDRESS:

20 (1) THE RECYCLABLE MATERIALS TO BE SEPARATED;

21 (2) THE STRATEGY FOR COLLECTION, PROCESSING, MARKETING,
22 AND DISPOSITION OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS;

23 (3) THE STRATEGY FOR THE COLLECTION, PROCESSING, AND
24 DISPOSITION OF THE POLYSTYRENE TRAYS USED IN PUBLIC SCHOOL
25 CAFETERIAS; AND

26 ~~(4) METHODS OF FINANCING THE RECYCLING EFFORTS; AND~~

27 ~~(5)~~ (4) METHODS FOR PROMOTING AND DETERMINING
28 COMPLIANCE WITH THE RECYCLING PROGRAM.

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before September
30 1, 2012, the Prince George's County Board of Education shall submit to the Prince

1 George's County Delegation to the General Assembly a report regarding the recycling
2 program established under § 4-127 of the Education Article, including:

- 3 (1) a copy of the recycling program;
- 4 (2) the status of the implementation of the recycling program; and
- 5 (3) the methods used to promote and determine compliance with the
6 recycling program requirements.

7 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
8 July 1, 2012.
