## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

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## Maryland Energy Administration – Study on the Use of Solar Panels on School Buildings

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Energy Administration to establish a 5 workgroup to study the feasibility of creating a program to use county and State 6 school buildings for the collection of solar energy; authorizing the 7 Administration to include certain persons in the workgroup in its discretion; 8 requiring the workgroup to consider certain cost savings, examine certain laws 9 that would need to be amended to facilitate a program and to streamline procedures under a program, consider the desirability of establishing a certain 10 pilot program, and make certain surveys to determine certain levels of interest 11 12in participating in a program; requiring the workgroup to submit a report of its 13 findings and recommendations by a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to a study on the use of solar panels on school 14 buildings. 15

16 Preamble

WHEREAS, State and county school buildings offer large flat surfaces that are ideal for the installation of solar panels; and

WHEREAS, School buildings are also usually a great distance away from tall buildings and trees, making them ideally exposed to sunlight; and

WHEREAS, In these times of tight school board budgets, the generation of electricity could provide local school boards with an additional funding source or cost—saving measure; now, therefore,
