- A scholarship awarded under this section shall supplement any federal 1 (d) 2 education benefits for which a recipient qualifies as a result of an individual's military 3 service or status as a dependent of a member of the armed forces or of a veteran of the 4 armed forces. 5 (e) Each scholarship may be used, at any eligible institution, to pay for 6 educational expenses as defined by the Office, including: 7 (i) Tuition and mandatory fees; and 8 (ii) Room and board. 9 The annual amount of a scholarship may not exceed 50% of the 10 equivalent annual tuition, mandatory fees, and room and board of a resident undergraduate student at the 4-year public institution of higher education within the 11 University System of Maryland, other than the University of Maryland University 12 13 College and University of Maryland, Baltimore, with the highest annual expenses for 14 a full-time resident undergraduate. 15 A scholarship recipient shall maintain a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. 16 17 Each recipient of a scholarship under this section may hold the award for 18 5 years of full-time study or 8 years of part-time study. 19 A scholarship recipient shall file for federal and State financial aid by 20 March 1 of each year. 21The Office may not award an initial scholarship to an individual (1) 22after June 30, [2016] **2020**. 23The Office may renew a scholarship after June 30, [2016] **2020**, if (2)the individual received an initial scholarship before that date. 2425 A Senator or Delegate may authorize the Office to award all or a portion 26 of the funds authorized under Subtitles 4 and 5 of this title to eligible recipients of 27scholarships awarded under this section.
