BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Public Utilities 8-202.(a) The Commission may not authorize telephone company charges to (1)be levied for directory assistance calls made by residential customers on the first two
